



## Great Lakes Clean Boat Initiative Progress Report – September 2008

### Introduction

Recreational boating is a hugely popular activity in the Great Lakes and a significant component of the region's economy. Nearly 4.3 million boats are registered in the eight Great Lakes states. These boaters spend nearly \$16 billion dollars on boats and boating activities in a single year. The Great Lakes Regional Collaboration announced the Great Lakes Clean Boat Initiative in October 2007. The goal is to spread the message that recreational boaters can easily reduce the impact of their activities and help protect the Great Lakes by adopting some simple practices.

Through the Clean Boats Initiative, the Great Lakes Regional Collaboration has declared the 2008 boating season a summer-long celebration of sustainable recreational boating throughout the Great Lakes. The basin-wide “Clean Boats Every Day” Initiative highlights the work of several national, state, and local outreach campaigns. Events held throughout the summer taught participants how to inspect, clean, and drain their boats in order to prevent the spread of AIS.

### Status

- An informal, multiple-agency steering group has been established to help coordinate the effort.
